The Brookfield Times - January 3, 1896

"Hiram P. Gerald an Embezzler and Fugitive from Justice. The story of Hiram P. Gerald's downfall has been the leading topic of conversation since Monday morning. The newspapers have been full of all kinds of gossip detailing his crooked transactions until from one end of the country to the other the missing Brookfield Savings Bank treasurer has become known, people everywhere are anxiously scanning the papers, eager to catch the latest gossip concerning his dishonest transactions. As is usual, the "I told you so's," are very much in evidence, so much so indeed, that one might infer that had they been consulted sooner the downward career of Mr. Gerald might have been checked, if not stopped entirely. From the great mass of wild rumors and idle talk that is going the rounds, it is almost impossible to gain anything like the truth of how many have been victimized by the absconding treasurer."
